

We have land in the building area BA1 that is significant Green Belt land. This should be growing our home-produced food after Brexit. As well as field edges to the open plains to show our school children wildlife and wild chalky flora. Food may be so significant after Brexit that a new series of allotments would be required for the new homes. To grow food in this soil tilled and sown by the council-owned farms would be excellent for allotment use.

There are equivalent to 11,000 new cases of child asthma a day caused by pollution in a recent study, so a new road should not be built especially by the planned new schools. Pollution is toxic even at WHO levels. Surely if petrol and diesel cars are to be discouraged from the new estate, garages on houses should not be built thus making more room for people. A carpark for all residents could be built and charged for.

Today the first swallows of April fly to the old farm barns. The proposed new road may have a few trees for the new estate but the swallows, skylarks and corn buntings need the open field plains and edges for their insect diet. At night Hares, Badgers, Foxes, Muntjac and Owls crossing the new road to add to the present roadkill. We have no hedgehogs now on the Bygrave road.
